WP5 Strategic Objective 1:

Support the development of a natural-, social- and humanistic- scientific transatlantic ocean data platform or portal with historical, current and future ocean data;

WP5 Strategic Objective 2:

Define a minimum set of ocean metadata standards and formats to be used by local, regional and national initiatives in the Atlantic basin.

Achieving S01 and S02 is the first step towards establishing more complex social-technological environments, e.g. the Competence Centre for Marine and Coastal Data of the Global South, which will be a synonym for excellence, capacity development, transdisciplinary, standardization, and collaborative approach across institutions.

Sharing experiences, best practices and (meta)data standards avoids working in isolation and duplication, while fostering mutual support and knowledge transfer.
