## ZMT's Regional Alumni Conference in Southeast Asia from 23<sup>rd</sup> -27<sup>th</sup> April 2018 in Bandung, Indonesia

ZMT's alumni from Southeast Asia is holding a conference at the Padjadjaran University (UNPAD) in Bandung, Indonesia from 23<sup>rd</sup> - 27<sup>th</sup> April 2018. The main topic of the conference is "Marine biodiversity for future life: threats, ecosystem services, and connectivity." The main goals of the conference are a synthesis of the ongoing research related to marine biodiversity and its threats as well as the development of joint projects with ZMT but also among the regional alumni network. The three-day alumni conference is combined with a two-day workshop on genetic barcoding.

A conference concept on "Sustainability of East African Marine Ecosystems and Regional Linkages" has been submitted to the DAAD Nairobi by our active alumni network in East Africa. The alumni conference is planned to be held in Bagamoyo, Tanzania from 1st - 4th March 2018. Further information will follow.

The Western Indian Ocean Marine Science Association (WIOMSA) organised its 10<sup>th</sup> Scientific Symposium from 30<sup>th</sup> October - 4<sup>th</sup> November 2017 in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania. ZMT took part with a booth at the exhibition alongside other organizations such as *Tanzania Fisheries Research Institute (TAFIRI)*, Wetlands International and WWF Tanzania.

## Arturo Dominici Aerosemena: Resilience Strategy Development in Panama City

How can a metropole like Panama City foster sustainable urban development beneficiary to all communities in it? This is one of the questions being addressed to ZMT Ambassador Arturo Dominici Arosemena, who is the Resilience Director at the Municipality of Panama. Panama City is a member of 100 Resilient Cities, a network supporting sustainable and resilient development of urban areas. During the first stage of the initiative, actions and perceptions were identified through various interviews and workshops kicking-off the development of a resilience strategy.
