The position is limited to 6 months with 40 h/month.

Tasks:

- Entering research data and metadata for completed projects into the data archive
- Communicating with the responsible scientists
- Performing quality checks of the data

- Bachelor or Master student in a field of study relevant to ZMT's research
- Knowledge of common MS Office programs
- Good speaking and writing skills in English and German
- Ability to work self-dependently
- Enthusiasm and curiosity for science topics and research data management
